

RESOLUTION

On motion of Dr. Vinicio Madrigal, seconded by Bruce Layburn, the following resolution was offered:

JEDCO RESOLUTION TO INCUR DEBT

WHEREAS, the Jefferson Parish Economic Development and Port District (“JEDCO”) is created pursuant to the authority of Chapter 20 of Title 34 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended (the “Act”), and is a special district of Jefferson Parish pursuant to LA R.S. 33:1420.18, as amended, and other constitutional and statutory authority; and

WHEREAS, Forward Jefferson Corporation (“FORJ”) borrowed money to finance the construction of the Building, as defined in that certain Building Lease and Purchase Agreement (the “Lease Agreement”) between JEDCO and FORJ executed February 20, 2009, located on property owned by JEDCO; and WHEREAS, the debt incurred by FORJ in the amount of \$2,830,000 to finance

the construction of the Building (the “Prior Loan”) matures and is due in full on February 20, 2016; and

WHEREAS, LA R.S. 39:1430, as amended (the “Bond Act”) authorizes JEDCO to issue revenue bonds (collectively, the “Bonds”) in order to borrow funds to finance the repayment of the Prior Loan and acquire the Building, as described in Section 24 of the Lease Agreement, and pay costs of issuance of the Bonds; and

WHEREAS, at its meeting held on July 16, 2015, the Louisiana State Bond Commission approved the issuance of the Bonds, conditioned upon receiving an appraisal showing that the Building is worth not less than the price JEDCO will pay to FORJ; and

WHEREAS, JEDCO desires to borrow not to exceed \$2,500,000, to bear interest at not to exceed seven percent (7%) per annum fixed rate and to mature not later than 20 years from its date of issuance (the “JEDCO Debt”), all as more specifically set out in the Offer to Purchase (the “Offer”) attached hereto and made a part hereof as Exhibit “A” prepared by the Purchaser, as defined therein; and

WHRRERAS, JEDCO will enter into a Trust Indenture (the “Indenture”) with a trustee (the “Trustee”) mutually agreeable to JEDCO and the Purchaser, the form of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof as Exhibit “B”; and WHEREAS, Jefferson Parish (the “Parish”) has agreed to pledge its credit, payable out of generally available funds of the Parish, and guarantee the JEDCO Debt, for the purposes of financing the repayment of the Prior Loan and enhancing economic development, growth and stimulus in the Parish, pursuant to the terms and conditions of the Cooperative Endeavor Agreement, the form of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof as Exhibit “C”.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY, by the Board of Commissioners of the Jefferson Parish Economic Development and Port District that:

SECTION 1. Pursuant to the authority of the Act and the Bond Act, JEDCO hereby authorizes the issuance of not to exceed \$2,500,000 of its Revenue Bonds, Series 2015. The details of the Bonds and the other provisions of their issuance, security and payment shall be as set forth in the Offer and the Indenture, said Indenture and Offer to be substantially in the form submitted at this meeting and filed with the official minutes of JEDCO, with such additions, omissions and changes as may be approved by bond counsel to JEDCO. The Bonds shall mature not later than twenty (20) years after their date of issuance and bear interest at a rate or rates not exceeding seven (7.0%) per annum for fixed interest rate bonds, all as provided in and subject to the terms of the Indenture.

SECTION 2. The Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary, Treasurer or Executive Director are hereby authorized and directed, for and on behalf of the JEDCO, to effectuate the sale and delivery of the Bonds and to implement this resolution, including the publication hereof as required by the Bond Act, the execution of the Indenture and other agreements, documents or certificates necessary to issue and deliver the Bonds is hereby authorized, including a certificate to designate the Trustee. Said officers are hereby further authorized and directed to approve, for and on behalf of and in the name of the JEDCO any changes, additions or deletions in any of the documents, instruments or certificates referred to in this resolution, provided that all such changes, additions or deletions, if any, shall be approved by bond counsel to the JEDCO and consistent with and within the authority provided in the Act and the Bond Act.

SECTION 9. This Resolution shall be published in one issue of the official journal of the Parish as soon as possible following its adoption. It shall not be necessary to publish the exhibits to this Resolution, but such exhibits shall be made available for public inspection at the JEDCO offices at reasonable times and such fact must be stated in the publication within the official journal.

WHEREAS, the United States Coast Guard is considering the reduction in the reserve forces stationed on Grand Isle that assist in the detection, monitoring and removal of the oil from the beach’s and marsh. The reduction by the United States Coast Guard of the forces on Grand Isle will adversely affect the ability of all parties to monitor and respond to oil as it continues to come ashore.





VENEZUELA ACEPTA READMITIR A COLOMBIANOS DEPORTADOS VENEZUELA AGREES TO READMIT COLOMBIANS DEPORTED

NEW YORK, ESTADOS UNIDOS- Venezuela está dispuesta a facilitar el regreso de los colombianos deportados en las últimas semanas por no tener los papeles en orden, anunció el lunes la Unión de Naciones Suramericanas.

La Unasur dijo en un comunicado que el gobierno venezolano acordó "que los ciudadanos colombianos deportados durante la crisis fronteriza entre ambos países que deseen regularizar su situación en Venezuela y regresar a ese país, lo puedan hacer con la ayuda de este gobierno", en alusión al venezolano.

Unasur indicó que el acuerdo fue alcanzado en un encuentro entre el presidente venezolano Nicolás Maduro y el secretario general de ese bloque Ernesto Samper en las Naciones Unidas, donde se desarrolló la Asamblea General del organismo mundial.

El acuerdo se inscribe en el marco de las medidas de distensión adoptadas por Maduro y el presidente colombiano Juan Manuel Santos en Quito la semana pasada, en una reunión en la que se comprometieron a impulsar negociaciones diplomáticas después de un mes de fuertes enfrentamientos verbales tras la expulsión de unos mil 500 colombianos que vivían en

Venezuela y la posterior salida voluntaria de otros 18 mil, según cifras de la ONU, por temor a represalias.

En la reunión de Quito ambos presidentes aceptaron flexibilizar el tema humanitario. Previamente habían puesto en marcha un corredor humanitario para escolares que quedaron atrapados en Venezuela por el cierre fronterizo pero estudian en Colombia.

Donamaris Ramírez, alcalde de la frontera ciudad de Cúcuta, comentó telefónicamente a The Associated Press que la medida sólo cobija a los colombianos que fueron deportados a Colombia desde Venezuela. De acuerdo con el funcionario, los deportados no llegan a dos mil, mientras que el número de expulsados puede ser de 20 mil.

De todos modos, enfatizó el burgomaestre, "es una excelente noticia la que ha logrado Unasur". En su concepto, Maduro "ha empezado a reconocer sus errores" sobre el manejo que les dio a las deportaciones y expulsiones sin respetar el debido proceso que les asistía a esos colombianos que vivían en territorio venezolano. El 19 de agosto pasado, el gobierno de Maduro ordenó el cierre de la frontera colombo-venezolana tras las heridas que presuntos contrabandistas —según Caracas paramili-

tares— les produjeron a tres miembros de la Guardia Nacional de Venezuela.

Venezuela agrees to readmit Colombians deported

NEW YORK, UNITED STATES Venezuela is willing to facilitate the return of Colombians deported in recent weeks for not having papers in order, announced Monday the Union of South American Nations.

UNASUR said in a statement that the Venezuelan government agreed "that Colombian citizens deported during the border crisis between the two countries wishing to regularize their situation in Venezuela and returned to that country, they can do it with the help of this government," referring Venezuelan. Unasur said the agreement was reached in a meeting between Venezuelan President Nicolás Maduro and the secretary general of the bloc Ernesto Samper at the United Nations, where the General Assembly of the world body develops.

The agreement falls within the framework of the measures of distension adopted by Maduro and Colombian President Juan Manuel Santos in Quito last week at a meeting in which they pledged to promote diplomatic negotiations after a month of strong verbal sparring after expulsion of some 500 thousand Colombians living

in Venezuela and subsequent voluntary departure of another 18 thousand according to UN figures, for fear of reprisals. In the Quito meeting both presidents agreed to relax the humanitarian issue. They had previously launched a humanitarian corridor for schoolchildren trapped in Venezuela by the border closure but studying in Colombia. Donamaris Ramirez, mayor of the border town of Cucuta, told The Associated Press by telephone that the measure only covers Colombians were deported to Colombia from Venezuela. According to the official, the deportees do not reach two thousand, while the number of expelled may be 20 thousand.

Anyway, the mayor emphasized, "it is excellent news which has made Unasur". In his view, Maduro "has begun to recognize their mistakes" on the management that gave deportations and expulsions without respect for due process to those attending them Colombians living in Venezuela.

On 19 August last, Maduro's government ordered the closure of the Colombia-Venezuela border after the injuries alleged smugglers —according Caracas paramilitares— produced them three members of the National Guard of Venezuela.






