MILLAGE ELECTION

RENEWAL OF EXISTING TAX
NOT A NEW TAX

CONSOLIDATED ROAD LIGHTING

UNINCORPORATED EASTBANK, WESTBANK AND TOWN OF JEAN LAFITTE
RENEWAL not to exceed 3 mills

- Would continue to provide funds to acquire, construct, improve, maintain, and operate road lighting facilities in the District.
- The renewal of this millage is essential to power and properly maintain approximately 40,000 street lights throughout Unincorporated Jefferson Parish.
- The renewal of this millage is necessary to continue to replace deteriorated wiring and pole systems some of which are nearly 50 years old.
- The renewal of this millage would provide funds to install new lighting systems along the remaining unlighted thoroughfares of Unincorporated Jefferson Parish.
- Street lights add to the safety of the traveling public, the security of residential and business properties, and the continued economic development of the Parish.



SPECIAL SERVICES

CRIMINAL JUSTICE 40%, CULTURE/PARKS 20%, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT 20% AND SENIOR SERVICES 20%
RENEWAL not to exceed 2.5 mills

- Renewal of one mill of no more than 2.5 mills to be used to provide support, maintain, administer, and operate judicial services in the criminal justice system.

- Would continue to provide funds to the 24th Judicial District Attorney's office.
- Would continue to provide funds to Juvenile Court for Process Servers.
- Would continue to provide funds for the West Bank Security Task Force.
- Would continue to provide funds for the operation of the offices of Constables and Justices of the Peace.
- Would continue to provide funds for the position of Crime Prevention and Quality of Life Coordinator.
- Renewal of one-half mill of no more than 2.5 mills would continue to provide funds to maintain, administer, and operate park facilities and programs and cultural facilities, including operation and management of the Jefferson Performing Arts Center. Half will be dedicated specifically to culture and the other half will be dedicated specifically to parks.
- Renewal of one-half mill of no more than 2.5 mills would continue to provide funds to be used by the Jefferson Business Development and Economic Service Fund to promote industry, trade, and commerce by providing economic and planning assistance to business enterprises located in or to be located in the District.
- Renewal of one-half mill of no more than 2.5 mills would continue to provide funds to be used by the Jefferson Community Senior Service Fund to provide, assist, support, administer, and maintain services and programs for the elderly in the District.
- This millage is the sole source of funding for the Office of Senior Citizens Services and pays for programs, services, and operations.
- There are 6 Senior Centers in Jefferson Parish.
- A portion of the millage supports funding for the Jefferson Council on Aging, Meals on Wheels Program, educational, and cultural programs and services for senior citizens.

JUDICIAL AND CULTURE

PARISH-WIDE
CRIMINAL JUSTICE 50% CULTURE/PARKS 50%
RENEWAL not to exceed 1 mill

- Renewal of one-half of no more than 1 mill would continue to provide funds to the Jefferson Court and Judicial Service Fund to be used to provide, maintain, administer, and operate judicial services in the criminal justice system.
- Renewal of one-half of no more than 1 mill would continue to provide funds to the Jefferson Community Park and Culture Service Fund to be used to provide, maintain, administer, and operate cultural and park facilities and programs in the Parish, of which 1/2 will be dedicated specifically to culture and the other 1/2 will be dedicated specifically to parks.



AMBULANCE SERVICE

DISTRICT 2-GRAND ISLE VOTERS ONLY
RENEWAL not to exceed 5 mills

- Would continue to provide funds to acquire, construct, improve, maintain, and operate ambulance service facilities in District 2 in Grand Isle.

ROAD LIGHTING

DISTRICT 7-GRAND ISLE VOTERS ONLY
RENEWAL not to exceed 10 mills

- Would continue to provide funds to acquire, construct, improve, maintain, and operate road lighting facilities in District 7 in Grand Isle.
